

How to include an image

1. You'll need an image of the right width

2. Upload the image

You will have to apply to Ben (ben@evolutioncomputing.co.uk) for an FTP account. This will allow you access to a directory on the website server. The directory will be something like /dnsAuthors/YourName

3. Create your article

Write your website article using paragraphs

4. Insert the image

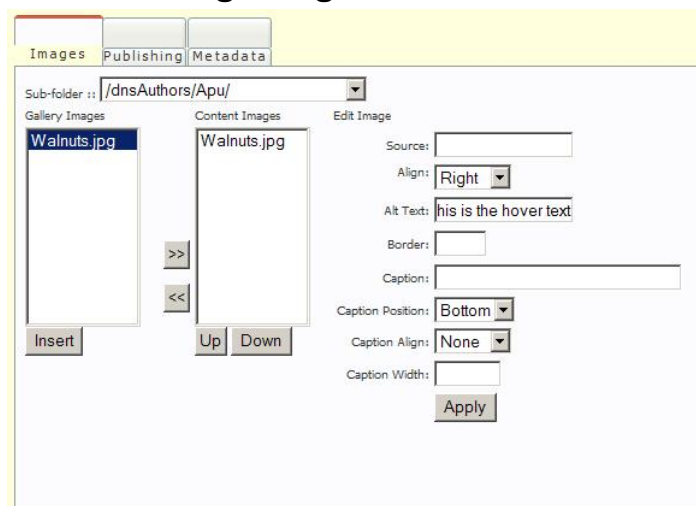
4.1. Create an image marker

Insert {mosimage} at the beginning of the paragraph where you want the image to be located (there is no need to put the image marker on a separate line)

4.2. Choose an image to go at the marker



In the image control box at the bottom of the edit page

- select the sub-folder (directory) to which you uploaded your images (/dnsAthors/Apu in this case).
- Select the image you want to insert from the left list
- use the button to add to the list of images to be displayed on your page.

4.3. Set image parameters

- Set
 - Image alignment (see below),
 - Alt Text (the image hover text)
- Press Apply (IMPORTANT)




